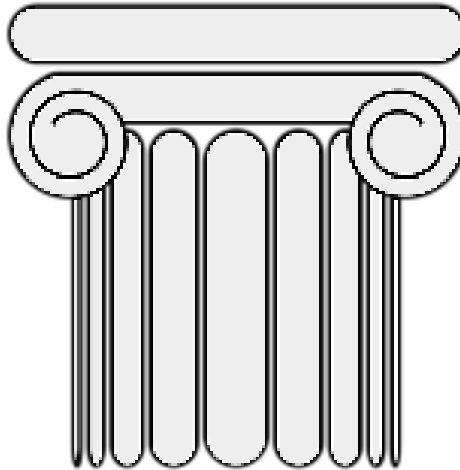

0.2 Percent (500 year)	3.8 feet above land surface	119.3 feet NAVD 1988

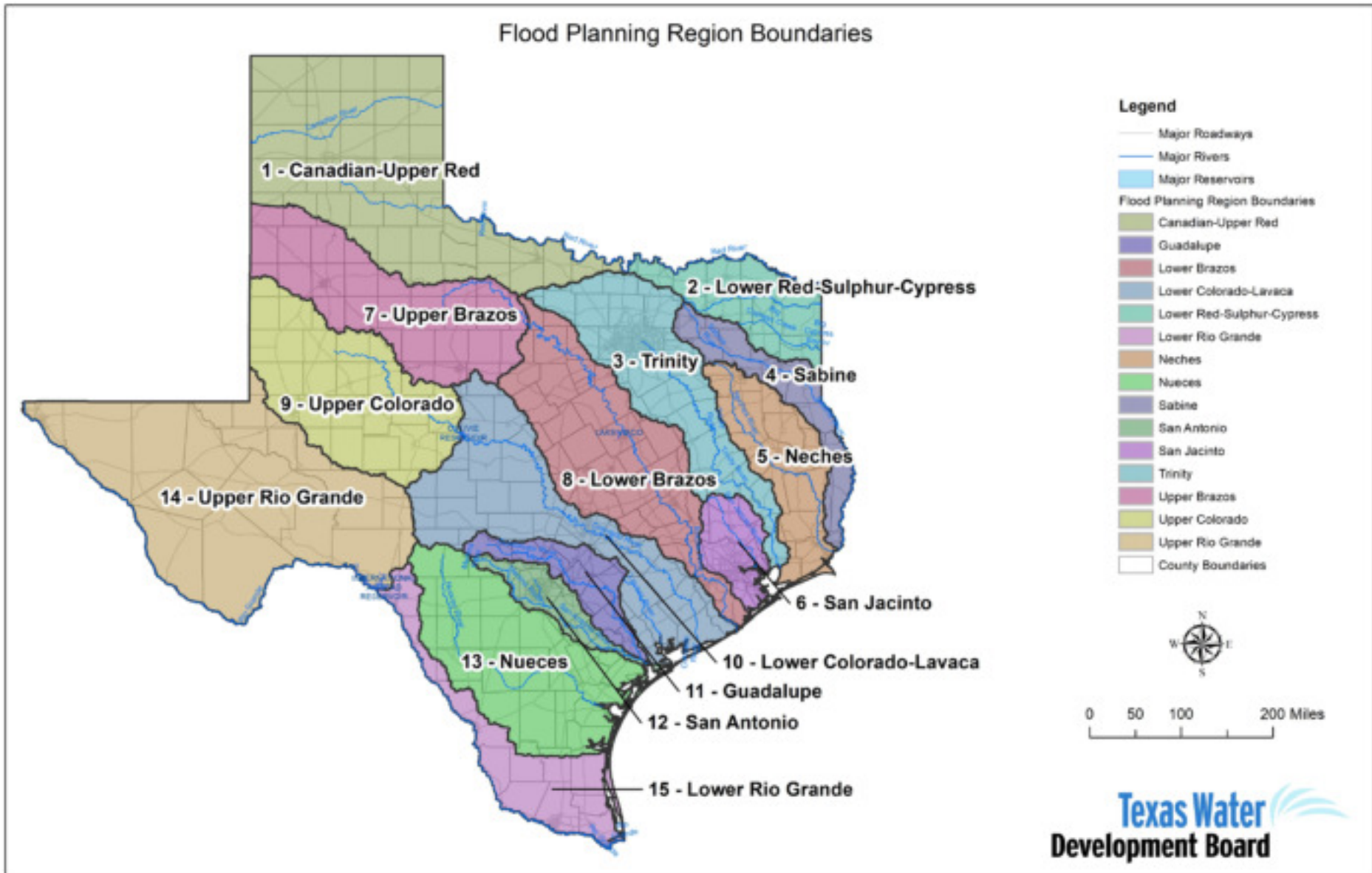


Victoria County, Texas

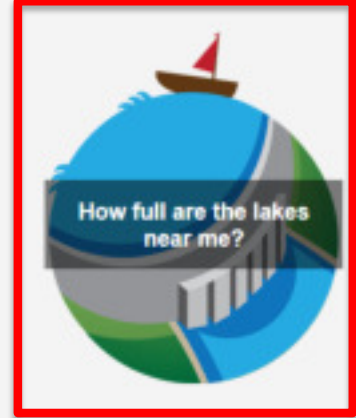
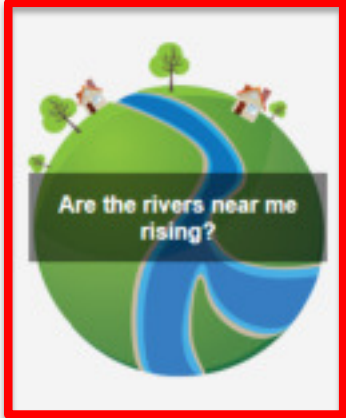
