

As the Deputy Regional Counsel, Clarissa Howley Mills provides oversight on Agency counseling matters related to air, water, hazardous waste, and chemicals in Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, and 66 federally recognized tribes. Clarissa manages the General Law Branch, which provides legal advice and policy recommendations in general and cross-cutting areas such as civil rights (Title VI), grants, appropriations, employment and labor law, ethics, Federal Indian Law, and others. Additionally, she is responsible for the management and administrative operations for the team of 75+ environmental attorneys in the Office of Regional Counsel, including tracking and distribution of ORC's budget and recruitment and hiring. Previously, Clarissa served as the Region's senior attorney for enforcement matters, focusing on risk management actions under Section 112(r) of the Clean Air Act, pesticides, toxics, and hazardous waste.
